Communicating with the Ill Child and Their Families: Lessons Learned from 20 years in Child Life

Michael will touch on his delicate work as a Certified Child Life Specialist, where he often plays the role of truth teller. He'll share the value of working as part of a team in the unique confines of a children's hospital, while respecting the power of hope, grace, and dignity. He'll also discuss the concept of family centered care in action.
