Dr. Martins' current scientific research is focused on the evolution and ecology of interactions between species. Dr Martins research on pollinators is well known and he has worked across East Africa with small-scale farmers and in a range of landscapes. He is a co-principal investigator of the Turkana Genome project. This project is pioneering the inclusion of African genomes and diversity in the wider picture of human adaptation and evolution.
