- EGL 491 or 492 is a prerequisite for EGL 494
- Survey Courses Take 1 at a time as they are dense and cover a lot of material.
- 300-Level Courses Reading/writing heavy; best to take 2 (max 3) per semester.
- EGL 494 is taken Senior Year Semester 1 and EGL 496 is taken Senior year Semester 2.
