

The single ticket option is a weekly purchase, and once the single-ticket code is activated, the viewer has 24-hours to view that week's films.

It is the summer of 1961, and Emil has just started working as an extra at DEFA Studio Babelsberg when he falls for a French dancer named Milou. Just as their relationship begins to blossom, they are torn apart when East Germany closes its border and erects the Berlin Wall. It looks like they will never be able to see each other again until Emil has a crazy idea: He's going to produce a movie so he can bring the love of his life back to Babelsberg. An epic tale told against the backdrop of history, this film is part comedy, part musical, part romance, and a pure joy from

beginning to end. Hand-picked for our audience, this is a spectacular opening film for this year's Stony Brook Film Festival.
