Seizing the opportunity to double the impact of their giving, over 1,500 alumni and friends responded to their challenge.

Stony Brook completed the Simons Challenge in just 12 months. The resulting \$201 million "Simons Effect" created a permanent sea change at the University, awakening a new philanthropic spirit, doubling the endowment, generating a record number of scholarships and professorships, and shining the national spotlight on the important work of our academic community.

CHALLENGE: Fighting Disease and Improving Human Health

When **Raymond Dalio**, founder of the investment firm Bridgewater Associates, wanted to support research on heart disease and stroke—two of the leading causes of death among adults in the United States—he turned to Stony Brook, where scholars are working at the cutting edge of cardiovascular medicine.

With matching gift support from the Simons Challenge, he endowed the Dalio Center for Cardiovascular Wellness and Preventive Research at Stony Brook Medicine. Today the Dalio Center, led by Dr. Michael Poon, is developing innovative, non-invasive treatment options for patients with and at risk of coronary artery disease, heart failure, and even Alzheimer's disease.

Doctor Poon and colleagues are pioneering breakthroughs in low radiation dose imaging that provide critical information about the progression of cardiovascular disease. These advances have inspired many Stony Brook friends and alumni to join the cause, including Carol Cheng '96, '97 and Eugene Cheng '97 who established the Carol and Eugene Cheng Cardiovascular Imaging Research Endowment to help purchase an EECP (Enhanced External Counter-Pulsation) for the Dalio Center, which enhances the blood flow to the heart and diminishes the symptoms of those suffering from heart failure. To attract and support even more of the brightest minds in the field of cardiovascular imaging, Charles A. Gargano, former U.S. Ambassador to Trinidad and Tobago, established the Ambassador Charles A.

Gargano Chair in Advanced Cardiovascular Imaging. Dr. Poon will be the inaugural holder of the Chair, ensuring his pioneering research on using CT imaging technologies will continue to generate new innovations that will reduce costs, improve patient care, and save lives.

Biomedical imaging is part of Stony Brook's intellectual DNA, for it was former Stony Brook Professor Paul Lauterbur who shared the 2003 Nobel Prize for his role in developing magnetic resonance imaging (MRI). To help harness today's most advanced form of this technology for the treatment of pediatric multiple sclerosis, Lisa Lourie and Robert Lourie established the Lisa and Robert Lourie Imaging Suite equipped with a new PET/MRI—one of only 10 in the U.S. In gratitude for their generosity, the Center for pediatric multiple sclerosis was newlyrenamed in their honor, the Lourie Center for Pediatric Multiple Sclerosis. The Lourie's gift will also enable Stony Brook's neuroscientists to understand more about the brain and spinal cord in relation to MS, epilepsy, amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, and other neurological disorders.

With a full complement of bioimaging technology in place, Stony Brook can also begin recruiting top bioimaging researchers thanks to **Pamela Hurst-Della Pietra** and **Stephen Della Pietra** and **Barbara Amonson** and **Vincent Della Pietra**, who established the Della Pietra Chair of Biomedical Imaging. Once recruited, this renowned scholar will advance the University's goal of becoming world class in three research areas for which imaging is critical: cardiovascular, neuroscience, and cancer. Finally, with science and medical knowledge ever evolving, it is vital that new generations of health care professionals receive a new generation of training, mentoring, and opportunities for research. This is the aim of the new Miriam and David Donoho Academy of Clinical & Educational Scholars, endowed by **Miriam Donoho** and **David Donoho**, which will teach the teachers and foster scholarship in academic medicine.



CHALLENGE: Sustainable Health Care and Ecosystems in **Developing Countries**

Philanthropists **Robin** and **Jim Herrnstein** are partnering with Stony Brook to bring vital health care resources to the country of Madagascar through the new Stony Brook University Global Health Institute. Madagascar possesses one of the most biologically diverse and important ecosystems on the planet. For 27 years, scientists and students in Stony Brook's Centre ValBio research station, led by Professor of Anthropology Patricia Wright, have been working with local populations to improve conservation efforts and the community's quality of life. Joining forces with Centre ValBio, the Stony Brook Global Health Institute will conduct internationally led health science research for the benefit of the Malagasy people, while collaborating with the Herrnsteins' new nongovernmental organization PIVOT in the effort to establish a sustainable health care infrastructure in one of the world's poorest nations.

CHALLENGE: Improving Collaboration and Communication

Alan Alda has been called an "evangelist" for improving the public's understanding of science. A celebrated actor, director, and writer, Alda is also a founding board member of Stony Brook University's Center for Communicating Science, renamed in his honor at this year's Stars of Stony Brook Gala. Along with \$2 million raised for scholarships, the Gala also generated an additional \$2 million to benefit the Alda Center's mission of training the next generation of scientists and health professionals to clarify their research and its impact more effectively with the public, elected officials, the media, and colleagues in other sciences.

Several friends and alumni made gifts to journalists of the future, including two members of President Stanley's Cabinet. Senior Vice President of Administration **Barbara Chernow** and her husband **William Farber**, in honor of Barbara's mother, established the Carol Chernow Memorial Scholarship in Journalism to provide support for developing writers. For aspiring public affairs journalists, Stony Brook's Vice President of External Relations **Elaine Crosson** and her son **Daniel** established the Matthew T. Crosson Memorial Scholarship in Journalism in memory of her husband and his lifelong dedication to informed public dialogue and its critical role in shaping public policy.

And thanks to funding from the **Cherith Foundation**, faculty at the Center for News Literacy are introducing journalism concepts and skills to areas of the world without a tradition of a free press or spirit of inquiry.

CNN Chief International Correspondent and ABC News Global Affairs Anchor **Christiane Amanpour** gave generously in support of the next generation of foreign correspondents with a gift to the School of Journalism in support of the Marie Colvin Center for International Reporting, established in part by the **Marie Colvin Memorial Fund.** Amanpour's gift as well as generous donations from News Corp CEO **Rupert Murdoch** have significantly expanded the Center's ability to send more student journalists on overseas reporting trips and raise awareness of the importance of international news coverage.



CHALLENGE: Creating New Knowledge from Big Data

Today, rapid acceleration in the volume of complex data pervades nearly all aspects of scientific discovery and, increasingly, human life. Thanks to an **anonymous** donor and the Simons Foundation, Stony Brook's new Institute for Advanced Computational Science will harness "big data's" potential for solving complex problems in the physical sciences, medicine, life sciences, sociology, industry and finance. Under Director Robert Harrison, a distinguished expert in highperformance computing from Oak Ridge National Laboratory, the Institute will attract leading faculty and graduate students in the field, sparking new innovations and discoveries in this rapidly emerging field.

CHALLENGE: Safeguarding Our Oceans and Food Supply

Dr. Carl Safina is playing a long game. As our oceans and nature in general bear the brunt of human-made climate change, overfishing, forest destruction, wildlife declines and the crush of human numbers, he remains determined "to show and tell the greatest story there is: the unity of life. To explore the constantly changing answers to the questions, 'What is our relationship to the world? What should it be? How does our relationship to the world affect our relationships with one another." His goal? To show that information from science is crucial to ethical decision making. To help him do just that, five donors convened by Ann Hunter-Welborn from Safina's nationwide community of passionate supporters came together to fund the Carl Safina Endowed Research Chair for Nature and Humanity at Stony Brook. And while we're thinking ahead and beyond, Stony Brook researchers are still tackling what can be done today.

For example, the once-rich shellfish beds of Long Island's Shinnecock Bay may thrive again thanks to an ambitious environmental restoration project funded in part by the **Laurie Landeau Foundation**. After years of overfishing, decreased water quality, and intensifying algae blooms, Shinnecock Bay's hard clam fishery was almost completely wiped out. Now scientists and students at Stony Brook's School of Marine and Atmospheric Sciences will spend the next five years restoring the health of this vital ecosystem, replenishing the bay with clam sanctuaries, eel grass, and other remedial measures that will help the bay filter itself naturally. When completed, the Shinnecock Bay Restoration Program will also serve as a template for similar efforts worldwide.

By protecting the well-being of the world's waters, we are also protecting our own health. Skyrocketing levels of mercury in today's marine animals are posing serious threats to human health, interfering with brain and nervous system function. After experiencing mercury poisoning himself, **Richard Gelfond '76**, CEO and Director of IMAX Corporation and Chair of the Stony Brook Foundation Board of Trustees, founded the Gelfond Fund for Mercury Related Research and Outreach. With his vital financial support, Stony Brook researchers are improving physician awareness and advancing scientific and public understanding of the impact of mercury in our food supplies coming from our waters.

CHALLENGE: Cultivating Cross-Cultural Understanding

Stony Brook has always upheld the great promise of American public higher education. Today, that education is adopting an increasingly global perspective as our world becomes ever more connected through communication, commerce, and ideas.

The Simons Challenge inspired many donors to help strengthen global connections with gifts to a wide range of international fields of study. Stony Brook's Center for India Studies is already a preeminent center for Indian thought, history, linguistics, and culture in the U.S. This past year, Dr. Nirmal K. Mattoo, Executive Committee Chairman of Stony Brook's newly renamed Bishembarnath Mattoo and Sheela Mattoo Center for India Studies, and members of the Indian American community including Deepak and Neera Raj, made the largest gift ever to a U.S. public university for India studies to ensure future generations understand the contributions of India and Indic culture to the world. In addition, Dr. Mattoo's generosity also established the Nirmal and Augustina Mattoo Endowed Chair in Classical Indic Humanities. Thanks to Dr. Krishna R.S. Gujavarty, Chairman of Psychiatry at Good Samaritan Hospital and Medical Center, lectures by nationally prominent leaders from the Asian Indian community, funded by the Dr. Gujavarty Family Seminar Fund in India Studies, share their vision, insights and experience to help cultivate the next generation of Indian American thought leaders.

One of mankind's most ancient cultures will become a modern pillar of Stony Brook's intellectual community on the strength of several major gifts supporting Greek language, history, and culture. George J. Tsunis, Esq. and members of the Long Island and New York Hellenic communities came together to meet the Simons Challenge by establishing the George and Olga Tsunis Center in Hellenic Studies and The James and Eleni Tsunis Chair in Hellenic Studies at Stony Brook University, in honor of Tsunis' parents. In addition, Peter V. Tsantes, treasurer of the New York chapter of the American Foundation for Greek Language and Culture, and his family, together with George Tsunis and family established the Peter V. Tsantes Professorship in Greek Literature and Greek Language to further explore and celebrate Greece's important literary legacy.

Italy's rich cultural history—in art, classical architecture, and other creative achievements—has had far-reaching influence on our country and the world. Stony Brook's celebrated Center for Italian Studies, which has published more than 30 books on Italy and Italian American affairs, provides an interdisciplinary academic home for studying Italian

language, literature, film, politics and the Italian American experience. Generous gifts from **Dr. Joseph L. Tromba '77** and **Richard T. Nasti '78** will fund lecture series. And the new Roberto and Palmina Mignone Fellowship in Italian and Italian American Studies will further enrich the Center's offerings.

The genesis of America continues to be a fascinating topic to research and explore, and it also continues to provide important

clues to the societal challenges we face today. This year, the **Gardiner Foundation** established The Robert David Lion Gardiner Chair in American History and a Center in American History at Stony Brook, which will provide our diverse student and faculty community with the exciting story of our shared past, as well as dedicated research reaching back to the earliest days of Suffolk County, Long Island, and New York; areas the Gardiner family helped establish.

By any measure, gifts from Stony Brook alumni and friends this year have transformed the lives of students, faculty, patients at Stony Brook Medicine, and residents of the Long Island State Veterans Home.

Testifying to the University's ongoing commitment to excellence in the arts, Stony Brook Foundation Trustee **Dorothy Lichtenstein** donated \$1 million to the Stony Brook Southampton Graduate Arts programs. Her gift will help fund several initiatives at the Southampton campus including scholarships, a new digital filmmaking program, and the David Rakoff Studio, dedicated to the late author and much-beloved faculty member in Southampton's MFA in Creative Writing program.

Stony Brook School of Dental Medicine's Advanced Specialty Education Program in Periodontics received a generous gift from the **Bud Tarrson Foundation for Dental Research** to establish its first-ever professorship: The Tarrson Family Professorship in Periodontology. The Tarrson Family expects the professorship to strengthen a program already notable for its educational, patient care, and basic and translational research achievements.

Stony Brook's Physics and Astronomy Department continues to be recognized for their groundbreaking work, and this year the University received a \$1 million gift in tribute to Nobel Prize winner and former Stony Brook professor C.N. Yang. The Founder of Bright Oceans Corporation in Beijing, China, **Dr. DENG Wei**, established the C.N. Yang-DENG Wei Endowed Chair in Physics and Astronomy. It was Dr. Wei's expressed wish that the Chair help advance the exchange of innovations, research and developments to benefit "the peaceful development of mankind."

Other major gifts included \$500,000 from the **Lundin Foundation** for construction at TBI-Ileret Research Station on Lake Turkana in Kenya where Stony Brook's professors and star anthropologists Meave, Louise, and Richard Leakey are finding exciting clues to early man. The study of our republic's early years also received a boost when alumna **Cynthia G. Mitchell '11** donated \$125,000 to Stony Brook's History department for scholarships and excellence.

Between 2012 and 2013, Stony Brook Children's made great strides in meeting a \$9 million **anonymous** matching gift challenge to help reach a \$25 million goal for building facilities that will expand Suffolk County's only children's hospital, adding:

- more space to the pediatric Intensive Care Unit
- · more private, family-centric rooms
- patient playrooms
- a family lounge

Even more gratifying for the Hospital faculty, patients, and staff has been the community's outpouring of support. The Hospital accepted proceeds from local fundraising events including those sponsored by the Rotary Club of Stony Brook, the Holiday Inn Express, Suffolk Bicycle Riders, Lexus of Smithtown, Nassau Suffolk Queens Combined Philoptochos, McGann Mercy High School, Adelberg Montalvan Pediatric Dentists, and dozens of elementary schools across Suffolk County who participated in the annual "Change for Children" coin collection program.

DEAR FRIENDS,

I am often asked why it is so important for Stony Brook to build a stronger, healthier endowment. I am delighted to have this opportunity to answer, because I believe it is the key to unlocking our aspirations as a university and uplifting our relationships with alumni and friends like you.

Today, Stony Brook operates with one of the smallest endowments among all research universities in the United States. While the median endowment for Association of American Universities members is \$1.88 billion, Stony Brook's endowment is \$125 million. As you can see, we do much more with less than almost any of our peers. Imagine, then, how much further we could press, how much higher we could reach, if Stony Brook had access to similar resources as our peers. A stronger endowment will allow us to offer more scholarships and financial aid to support greater numbers of talented students without regard for their economic circumstances. It will put us in a stronger position to compete for the finest faculty, a critical measure of a university's reputation. It will give us the flexibility to support and empower exciting new research with the potential for saving or transforming lives. And it will ensure that the University's future is guided by its mission and priorities rather than external economic forces, such as diminishing state and federal funding. With the Simons Challenge, we made considerable progress toward achieving these goals. We doubled the University's endowment in record time. And yet, there is still so much more that each of us can do.
