# **Building Partnerships in Asia**



As part of the Office of Global Affairs' new strategicdevelopment plans, President Samuel Stanley, Jr. and Dr. Jun Liu, Vice Provostfor Global Affairs, traveled to China and South Korea to enhance existingrelationships and reach out to new partners. Focusing on student and faculty exchanges and research collaborations, PresidentStanley and Dr. Liu met government with several universities, agencies, businesses and alumni to broaden the scope of Stony Brook's activities in thetwo countries.

The China leg of the mission consisted of amulti-city visit to partner universities like Tongji University, SuzhouUniversity, Hong Kong Baptist University, and South University of Science andTechnology of China. In Shanghai, President Stanley and Dr. Liu met with Xi'an Jiaotong-Liverpool University to sharebest practices in running an overseas satellite campus. The mission led to several key developments Stony Brook's relationships in China, including potential new university collaborations and the exploration of a Stony Brook satellite office.

Inaddition to local universities, the delegation visited important governmenteducation institutions including the Chinese Ministry for Education, the StateAdministration of Foreign Expert Affairs (SAFEA), and Hanban (the Beijingheadquarters for the Confucius Institute), where they discussed Stony Brook'scollaborative efforts with China. They alsoexplored opportunities for Stony Brook students with industry leaders atmega-retailer Alibaba and the Suzhou-Singapore Industrial Park.

Under the umbrella of GSI, we are rebrandingexisting summer programs for international students and adding new certificate coursesto create a cohesive study abroad experience that will provide careerenhancingskills to overseas students and professionals. GSI will offer threeprograms: a three-week certificate program, a full-time summer session program with tracks for

Thenewly developed GSI Certificate Program will consist of a three-weekcertificate course in a variety of disciplines designed to enhance careerprospects. In addition to receiving instruction from top faculty, students will be offered language tutoring and participate cultural outings throughout Long Island and New York City.

The Summer Session tracks include all of Stony Brook's currentsummer exchange programs. During thissix-week program, students can choose from a mix of academic credits and languagecourses based on English language ability. GSI will offer scholarships in order to attract qualified international students.

Finally, the customizable program will be available to StonyBrook partners looking to create unique educational experiences. Programs will be developed upon request, andtailored to the individual needs of our partner institutions.
