Completion of the <u>Globalization Studies and International Relations</u> major requires 36 credits (12 courses), plus an additional 0-9 credits (up to 3 courses) for the language requirement. All courses applied to the major must be passed with a grade of C or higher. Each course can only be used to satisfy one of the four requirements. Besides those listed in the Bulletin, additional courses can be applied to the major with the approval of the advisor.

- 2. TWO Language courses at the 200-level (intermediate low), and ONE course at the 300-level (intermediate mid) or above, for a total of 9 credits, in a language other than English, or the equivalent competency demonstrated by passing the Challenge exam administered by the Language Learning Research Center (LLRC), with a C or higher. For most languages offered at SBU, the sequence would be **211**, **212** and then either **311** or **312**.

- 3. *THREE courses (9 credits), chosen in consultation with the GLI advisor from the electives listed under the various <u>Global Interaction Areas</u>.*
 - a. ONE of the courses must be taken at the 100/200 level (3 credits), the other TWO (6 credits) must be upper division courses [300- or 400-level].
 - b. The courses selected for this requirement can focus on more than one part of the world (Africa and the Americas, Asia and Europe, etc.). The Global Interaction Areas can be defined according to specific global flows and historic interrelations.

- 4. FOUR courses (12 credits), chosen in consultation with the GLI advisor from the electives listed under the various <u>Global Issues Tracks</u>.
 - a. TWO of the courses must be taken at the 100/200 level (6 credits), the other TWO (6 credits) must be upper division courses [300- or 400-level].
 - b. If the courses for this requirement are all chosen from the same Global Issues Track, the approval of the advisor is not needed. Other clusters can be created in consultation with the advisor.
