# **Giving Up the Goat:** Sacrifice and Substitution in **Bengali Goddess Worship**

To outward appearances, sacrifice is on the wane in Bengali Hinduism. Even at explicitly "tantric" Kali Pujas, one increasingly finds fruits and vegetables offered at points in the ritual where a goat had been customary even a generation ago. In other cases, the sacrificial portion of the puja has been elided entirely. Some differences in practice can be accounted for with references to classical Sanskrit legal texts (dharma shastras) and others according to the tantras themselves. Not all local variations depend on such theoretical rationales, however, so a short excursion into ethnography will round out the picture.



Joel Bordeaux is a Visiting Scholar at the Mattoo Center for India Studies. He received a B.A. in Religious Studies from Georgia State in 2003 and a Ph.D. in Religion from Columbia University in 2015. He is a specialist in the religions of South Asia, working primarily in Bengali and Sanskrit. His research explores how political authorities, canonical works of literature, and esotericism mediate differences between and within religious traditions.
