MAJOR REQUIREMENTS (36 CREDITS)

- Communication (COM) majors may double major or minor in Journalism (JRN) or Mass Communication (CMM). Required courses that overlap between programs will count towards each program. Double majors and minors cannot get double credit for the same elective. Elective courses will be counted once and only apply to one program. Communication majors may not minor in Communication and Innovation (CBI).
- All courses must be completed with a grade of C or higher to count toward the major.
- Required and elective courses counting toward the major & SBCs are **NOT** eligible for **G/P/NC**.
