

**Spike Millington** is Vice President of the International Crane Foundation and Director of the Asia Program. From 2012-2017 he was Chief Executive of the East Asian - Australasian Flyway Partnership, based in Incheon, Republic of Korea and bringing together 37 representatives of country governments, inter-governmental and international non-governmental organizations to conserve migratory waterbirds and their habitats in the 22 countries of the Flyway.
