Our Groundbreaking TV Pilot Incubator Launched!



INCUBATOR

The first of its kind at any university, this exciting new initiative is designed to nurture, inspire, and develop four original TV series so they can advance toward production.

The incubator will equip participants with the tools and industry insights to help bring their creative visions to life. A select group of television heavyweights will act as project mentors, including:

- **Bryan Goluboff** Executive Producer of *Elsbeth* and *Law and Order:* Organized Crime and George and Tammy
- Michael Rauch Showrunner on Instinct and Royal Pains
- Jacquelyn Reingold Executive Producer of *The Good Fight* and Writer on *Grace and Frankie*
- Steve Basilone Writer on Community and The Goldbergs

The program will be led by faculty member **Kris Lefcoe** and MFA in TV Writing Director **Alan Kingsberg**. Notable guests, including **John Coles**, **Tom Sellitti**, **Dan Perlman**, **L.E. Correia**, **Mary Rohlich**, and **Stephen Gates**, will lead workshops on verbal pitches, look books, pitch decks, budgeting, packaging and marketing opportunities.

Participation is exclusive to Stony Brook MFA in TV Writing graduates, and this year's group includes Walter Stafford '22, Jeff Bernier '22, Nelson Downend '22, Tristan Rodriguez '23, and Greg Abbey '23.

The lab will culminate in a pitch competition scheduled for January, where participants will present their concepts to a jury of industry buyers, producers, agents, and showrunners. Phase Two will launch in fall of 2025, with the goal of producing one of the four pilots.

Whether with work written during the program or using the skills they honed, these SBU TV writers and filmmakers continue to earn high accolades.

We are thrilled to announce that TV Writing alum **Nelson Downend** is the Grand Prize Winner of the Table Read My Screenplay competition. In Los Angeles, **Regina Ainsworth** (*Eva Lasting* on Netflix) directed a table read of **Downend**'s screenplay, *Rock Bottom*, which is also a Finalist at the <u>Austin Film Festival</u>.

Rock Bottom: Following a chance encounter while throwing up in the same public bathroom, a fifty-five-year-old alcoholic and a twenty-four-year-old bulimic form an unlikely bond as they attempt to address their unresolved trauma, mend fences with estranged family, and slowly head down the path toward recovery.

Downend also co-wrote a screenplay with fellow SBU TV Writing alum **Lisa Davey** titled *Fishtown Dicks*, which is a finalist in The <u>PAGE International Screenwriting Awards</u>. Additionally, **Sri Ram Burgula**'s short film *Tabassum* is a finalist for the <u>Tasveer Film Fund</u>, supported by **NETFLIX**, where nine U.S. narrative shorts finalists are competing for a \$25,000 grant.

At the <u>Austin Film Festival</u>, TV Writing student **Jon Baskin**'s comedic pilot *My Marshall* is a Finalist. Over at <u>Screencraft Animation & Family</u>, **Gabriel Brosius**'s Comedic Pilot *HomeBody* is a Quarter Finalist.

Lastly, TV Writing alum **Greg Abbey**'s thesis pilot script *Shark* is a finalist in The <u>PAGE</u> <u>Awards</u> and the <u>ScreenCraft TV Pilot Script Competition</u>. *Shark* won at The <u>Northfork TV</u> <u>Fest</u> and the <u>TrackingB TV Script Contest 2024</u>.

TV Writing MFA grad **Emma Gutt** has been promoted to Writers Assistant for **NETFLIX**'s *The Diplomat.*

History is made! *Mulata*, directed by **Yarilis Ramos** and produced by **Nnamdi Nwosa**, is our program's first student thesis filmed on the island of Puerto Rico. This groundbreaking project also marks the first full-Spanish period piece for our program. Stony Brook's Simone Pero Premieres Two Feature Films

Producing faculty member, **Simone Pero** is headed to the festivals! *LILLY*, which **Pero** produced, premiered at the <u>Hamptons International Film Festival</u> in October 2024. This narrative film focuses on the real-life story of fair pay activist **Lilly Ledbetter**, starring **Patricia Clarkson**.

Another one of her films, *VIVA VERDI!l* premiered at the 25th <u>Woodstock Film Festival</u> this October. The heartfelt documentary follows a group of retired opera singers living in a home built by composer **Giuseppe Verdi** as they mentor young musicians.

Pero shares her experience in both narrative and documentary films with students in her producing courses. Her social impact films address topics like the American healthcare system, abuse, and gender inequality.

Her second feature, *Bad Things*, premiered in competition at the 2023 <u>Tribeca Film Festival</u>, starring **Gayle Rankin**, **Hari Nef**, and **Molly Ringwald**.

Her debut feature, *Lyle*, a queer horror film, premiered at <u>Outfest</u> in 2014, with **Gaby Hoffmann** winning the Best Actress award.

In 2023, *Indiewire* named **Stewart** one of the top ten LGBTQ creators on the rise. She holds an MFA from NYU and is a recipient of the <u>San Francisco Film Society's</u> <u>Women Filmmaker Fellowship</u>, awarded to women in genre filmmaking.

In the following weeks, **Vachon** brought in A24, the film's distributor, and **Shimberg**'s manager as guests.
