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Office of Educational Effectiveness (OEE)	Administrative Office in the Provostial area with five highly motivated and enthusiastic experts to enable and support the implementation of high-quality processes to measure both student learning and administrative outcomes to sustain and advance excellence.
<u>Middle States Working</u> <u>Group 5- Educational</u> <u>Effectiveness</u> <u>Assessment</u>	Working group of faculty and staff charged with demonstrating how SBU meets accreditation requirements to demonstrate that our students have accomplished educational goals determined by the faculty and that assessment results are used for improvement. Work group activities 2022-2024.
Assessment Coordinator	A faculty member, program director, or administrator identified to coordinate assessment activities at the program level. Serves as the primary liaison between the program and the Office of Educational Effectiveness.
Assessment Council	A council of faculty members, charged by the Provost in consultation with the University Senate, to develop campus-wide policies and procedures for academic assessment, including general education and to provide ongoing oversight of assessment of student learning.
General Education Advisory Committee	An advisory committee of 12 faculty and 4 administrators, jointly constituted by University Senate and the Provost, charged with providing ongoing advice about the implementation, evaluation, and assessment of Stony Brook University's general education curriculum.
Ad Hoc Committee to Establish a Program Review Process	An ad hoc committee of 5 department chairs charged with recommending a process for a periodic review of Stony Brook's academic programs, including a focus on assessment of student learning outcomes and an external review component, consistent with SUNY policy. Charge to be completed in fall 2022.

Program Goals	 The program provides students with the tools for active and effective participation as professionals in legal counseling, advocacy and decision-making. The program prepares students for the study of law as an integral component of larger social, political, economic and ecological systems. The program employs the Socratic Method, problem-based learning, and simulated or experiential learning to help students develop their legal skills and abilities. 	
2022-2023 Accomplishments	 95% retention rate for the most recently admitted cohort. 75% of graduates passed the Bar Exam (higher than New York State pass rate of 66%). Increased admissions process selectivity by 5% compared to last year. 	
2022-2023 Improvements	 Inclusion of hybrid learning options in select courses. Successfully hired 2 new tenure-track FTEs with experience in distance learning. 5 Additional Teaching Assistantships offered. Expanded faculty office hours and leveraged scheduling support application to reduce administrative burden and increase student attendance at office hours. 	
2022-2023 Evidence that Prompted Improvement	 Feedback from student surveys indicating a desire for increased flexible and/or distance learning formats as we emerge from the pandemic. Feedback from student focus groups indicating a need for more one-on-one support in the classroom. Data from student course evaluations suggesting better outcomes in classes supported by TAs.
