To provide Hispanic business owners with information, guidance, network, ideas and training to help them to understand, utilize and grow their business by accessing government procurement.





What M/WBE is?

MWBE stands for Minority and Women Owned Business Enterprise. The M/WBE Program helps minority-and women-owned businesses to grow and thrive.

Article 15-A of the Executive Law, signed into law on July 19, 1988, authorized the creation of an Office (now Division) of a Minority and Women's Business Development to promote employment and business opportunities on state contracts for minorities and women.
Under this statute, state agencies are charged with establishing employment and business participation goals for minorities and women.





MWBE Business in Nassau County, New York

According to the Nassau County Office of Minority Affairs2020 Year-End Report

- As of August 2020, Nassau County registered approximately 600 new MWBEs and SDVOBs, representing approximately 42% of newly registered companies, and 28% of companies registered and qualified to do business with the county.
- There were less than a dozen MWBE and SDVOB registered to do business with the County in 2018.
- In late 2020, OMA certified 175 companies as Nassau County MWBE.







M/WBE Businesses in New York

According to the New York State Division of Minority and Women's Business Development

2020 - 2021 Annual Report:

- At 30.51% by 2021, New York State officially surpassed the nation's top goal, 30% MWBE utilization, in economic empowerment and hiring opportunities for MWBE.
- Total number of MWBE certified companies: 9,243 companies
- Number of companies certified / renewed in 2020-21: 1395 companies

NYS MWBE Certifications in Long Island:

- MBE: 484
- WBE: 548
- MWBE: 187
- Total: 1219

NYS MWBE expenditures in Long Island: \$460,388,513 NYC MWBE expenditures: \$958,860,809 NYS MWBE total expenditures: \$3,055,606,831
