Not SBU Students but there are some in the community

Q: 4/20 is coming up? Are we prepared, it is a Saturday and wanted to see if there are any health professionals around if a student overdoses or faints?

CPO is doing prevention events the week prior, but if there is an emergency call UPD/SBVAC

Many students are narcan trained if there is an instance of an opioid overdose Q: Cannabis, we are probably more concerned with students fainting or dehydration then overdose

SBVAC will be available that day. There is always 1 crew available 24/7, students are ready for back up calls, on a day like 4/20 will probably have more than 1 crew on call - like tonight at BrookFest will have about 16 EMT's there with paramedics
