• Strategic Enrollment Planning: Highlights (slide) - is about growing our research and education

Undergraduate & Graduate: To what extent should we planfully grow UG and/or Grad enrollment? And if we do, what are the most important factors to address?

- 1. 2 years ago, there was no strategy on how to grow and the need for the resources. More students in certain units than could be accommodated.
- 2. Monies could have gone to faculty or research equipment
- 3. Last of all public AAUs when it comes to advisors and tutoring for students.
- 4. USRC what recommendation can we make
- 5. Mix of students: In state / Out of state SBU 15% SBU needs to raise that number 30% / 70% Need a variety of intersectionality/diversity
  - a. 15% + 1% = \$700,000x15 increase in funds to accomplish what SBU needs to do more that \$40 million dollars (in 5 years)
  - b. Increase international student population
  - c. Target enrollment at departments SBU highest in the nations of publics for Pell Students
- 6. Need to raise our out-of-state tuition
- 7. More students build revenue more diverse
- 8. Graduate Need housing/dining/buildings/sewage/academic staff to grow our PhD programs
- 9. Student Housing need 3-4000 beds to support our research mission
- Questions:
- a. Q: Named a Flagship State needs to make an investment; Is there any sense that this type of investment to allow SBU to accelerate?

Carl Response: Raising in state tuition SBU is lower and so are many southern universities; not allowed to charge more for certain degrees; infrastructure - \$2 billion in deferred maintenance (\$85 million to maintain/year); we cannot buy our own building ; Chemistry should get a new building; Proposing Bio/Sciences Complex - generate NIH dollars; Earth Building; Need another Engineering Building; Business School Building; SBU Based Budget has been increased 2 years for inflationary cost;

b. Q: Out of state students targeted outreach to other states / schools / guidance counselors - to make aware of SBU

Carl Response: SBU Name change so that people are aware; Slide - 2024 50 Top Public College Stats - in order of ranking/cost

c. Q: Investment in important pieces of equipment needed in facilities.

Carl Response: VPR (Dr. Kevin Garner) is serious about how to access monies already in place.

• Understanding new budget harmonization initiative, IDC and return of funds to departments

Budget Model: IDC money goes to the Colleges/units - paying overhead, space, new lines (startups), etc. Deans begin to do and then test it out

Q: how would the library anticipate how much funds they have to use from overhead?

Carl Response, Faculty/Staff in Libraries on West Campus (slide) need to be clear about what the overhead is for the library - so as to keep up with inflationary costs.

- Follow up regarding library funding support: Pilot fund for Article Galaxy; Publication fees; policies for both east and west campus Worldcat - Services
- Staffing levels in office of grants management/OVPR for assisting with pre and post submission of grants

Keven has a plant to hire - positions to be filled How to put more post award into the units

• Issues related to IT divide between east and west campus Where there can be bridges - should solve the issue of two different email systems, but also take into consideration different needs in different disciplines.
