Valeria Bruni Tedeschi delivers a brilliantly lived-in performance as Sandra, a 50something, independent woman who works in a feminist bookstore, has no children by choice, and has carefully arranged her life to her liking. When Sandra first meets young Eliot, Eliot's father Alex—a neighbor she barely recognizes from the same apartment building—is foisting him upon her urgently as he races off with his very pregnant wife to the hospital. Little do any of them realize, this will be the beginning of a very unusual relationship that brings the question of what defines family to the foreground. Defying all the expected cliches, director Tardieu allows the story and the characters to instead remain very much in the realm of reality. This intimate, poignant, and ultimately joyous masterpiece should not be missed. A heart-warming and thought-provoking opening to our 30th anniversary.
